## Re-generating Ecosystems of Aravalli Range

### ARAVALLI BIODIVERSITY PARK (AREA-280 Ha. approx.)

- Unique landscape and biodiversity for protection of natural Aravalli ecology
- Conversion of depression area into Orchidarium, Fernarium for educational interest
- Mixed dry deciduous, hill top communities along natural trails developed in the first phase
- Specialized parks like butterfly park, sacred groves, medicinal and herbal garden developed
- Rock garden, cave communities, interpretation centre, conference under the plan
- Grasslands & Woodlands
